Prostate Cancer

Prostate cancer typically grows slowly and may not cause any symptoms in its early stages. However, as the cancer grows, it may begin to press against the urethra and cause symptoms such as difficulty urinating, frequent urination, blood in the urine, and pain in the back, hips, or pelvis. It's important to provide your patients with PSA testing and screening to ensure their prostate is healthy. If you have a patient that has an elevated PSA, refer them to our prostate clinic or one of our urologists for further evaluation.

Screening

It's also important to schedule your patients for routine prostate exams as BPH and other conditions, such as prostate cancer, can have similar symptoms. Early detection and treatment of BPH can help prevent complications and improve quality of life.
